

Our woodworking team at Fair Shares joined forces with the Wildlife Trust to help develop the Milton Avenue Nature Reserve in Podsmead. While the Wildlife Trust took on the conservation work we were asked to create some interesting and fun sculptures and signs. It was a really exciting project at every stage of the process



from sourcing the wood from another Nature reserve to the final installations. There was a great sense of satisfaction for everyone involved as they were a vital part of transforming the nature reserve and creating a new community space for Podsmead. FAIR SHARES YOUTH WORK

We're really excited to be working with young people for another year and finding new and interesting ways to get them involved in our communities. This will be the seventh year of our Gloucester Fair Shares Youth Project. During that time we have worked with over 250 young people from the age of 14 and up.

Rich, our youth worker, takes small groups of young people or sometimes one to one to do practical work. They might be repairing a broken fence, assembling flat pack furniture, painting a church hall, helping clear local gardens, or taking part in community events and loads more. Rich teaches them practical skills but also provides some mentoring.

Many of the young people have gained skills and confidence through their volunteering and have since moved on to jobs or further education. For some it was a life changing experience and has opened new doors and new opportunities. We're very proud that Frankie, one of the young people who had started with our youth project and more recently has been working with us, received an award for Young Person of the Year at the Matson, White City and Robinswood Community Awards. It is well deserved and Frankie has become an invaluable member of our team.

We've been very fortunate that this work has been funded by the Office of the Gloucestershire Police and Crime Commissioner's Fund. We can't thank Martin Surl, the PCC, and his team enough for enabling us to do this vital work.







INTRODUCING ONE OF OUR YOUNG PARTICIPANTS

Ryan is one of our young participants who came to us two years go. He wanted to work with animals so we linked him with the St James City Farm and he has been volunteering with us and the farm ever since. He started off very shy but soon got into the swing of things and his confidence keeps on growing.

He's an excellent role model and now he even mentors other volunteers and looks after larger school groups.

Recently Ryan has spent lots of hours revamping the chicken area at the farm which was in a fowl state and to thank him for his work we named the area after him. The picture shows him receiving a Plaque from Deputy Police and Crime Commissioner Chris Brierley.

FAIR SHARES PRISONS PROJECTS

Our work encouraging volunteering in our local prison continues to flourish. Prisons have lots of male and female offenders who give up their free time to help fellow inmates in many different ways; for example by teaching reading, maths and by being Samaritans. The prisoners sign up with Fair Shares and are then able to send out hours to help their families or they donate their hours to us to use to help people in Gloucester.

So far prisoner hours have been used in Gloucester to tidy up gardens and outdoor spaces, and to help someone move in an emergency. If you know a family who has someone in prison who could benefit from a few hours volunteering please contact Lucia or Shelley.

Some prisoners are able to send the hours out to help their own family and we will be helping a grandmother with their garden very soon. For offenders who live elsewhere we try to connect with other time banks. One time bank in Wales has swapped some of the prisoners volunteering hours for vouchers and two sets of children have managed to go on days out provided for them by their parents volunteering within the prison.
