### SHARING FOOD

Well Covid has turned everyone's lives upside down including ours here at Fair Shares. We couldn't do our usual thing of encouraging people to help out in each other's homes or to come together for group activities or social events. Instead we've just tried to find opportunities where people can support each other in safe and physically distanced ways. For some that was about shopping or picking up prescriptions for shielded people. Others have been phoning and keeping in contact with those who may not have been able to see their friends and family because of lockdowns. One of the biggest things we did this year though was to start a new food project.

Since March we've been working with The Friendship Cafe and a whole team of community helpers to cook and deliver hot healthy meals every weekday throughout the year. Through many generous donations and grants, meals have been

given out for free to a whole range of people who have been struggling for one reason or another. It was a way to harness all the amazing community spirit to make life better for people in a small but important way. This of course couldn't have been done without all the kind, generous and talented participants who have given their time to shop, prepare, cook, chop, wash, pack and deliver the food, and always with a smile.

In total, over 12,200 meals and 350 food parcels have gone out supporting over 600 people in the community. 82 people have given over 4000 hours of their time to help do this. The photo on the next page shows just some of these amazing community champions.

### A YEAR IN ART

The Fair Shares Art Project started the year with some great achievements with a project at the Phoenix Centre, repurposing pallet wood into usable storage and furniture. We also enjoyed an exciting upcycling construction project working with people from Greensquare Housing.

In spite of this year's challenges, there have been some really positive outcomes. Our Tuesday art group shared and learnt a number of practical skills including bag and cushion making, cake decorating and making bunting for our Allotment at the City Farm. We developed our drawing, paper craft, painting and mosaic making abilities and made remembrance poppy brooches to gift to others. We also found creative ways to share kind words of support and to express how we are feeling.

Overwhelmingly, our participants have shown incredible friendship to one another when it has been needed the most, and this year we have learnt so much more about each other than before. During the lock downs we have continued to talk and pass messages over the phone, and our friendships, understanding and appreciation of one another has grown so much this year whilst being apart. Wonderful moments have come out of these difficult times.

### FAIR SHARES AND THE GEM PROJECT

The GEM Project (Going the Extra Mile) has workers in different community organisations across Gloucestershire who help people along the path towards further education, training or employment. It's for those people who may have been out of work for a period of time for many different reasons and just need a helping hand. Farhanah is our GEM Navigator Developer here at Fair Shares.

Dan's been a participant of Fair Shares since he was 16 and has been with our young people's project doing various bits of work in and around the community. He had also started a Motor Vehicle course at college. However, he unfortunately faced some difficulties in his life, which meant he was unable to complete his qualification. He continued to help out with Fair Shares though and after gaining more confidence and maturity through the work he was doing with us he wanted to start planning ahead with his life and career plans. This is where we introducted him to Farhanah and he signed onto the GEM Project.

"I have been volunteering since I was 16, particularly in gardening and DIY type roles. I'm really keen to pursue an outdoors based career, possibly with the National Trust but as I haven't been very strong with my studies I thought I might need a bit of help to get back on the right path."

Working with Farhanah, Dan has been building his educational profile. GEM gave him his very own laptop so he could complete various online courses including English and ICT skills to help build his CV ready to apply for jobs. He has also taken on several new Fair Shares opportunities at our woodworking workshop, the allotment and the City Farm.

"Fair Shares and The GEM Project have helped me find out who I am. Not only has it helped me with moving closer towards work, but Farhanah has also helped sort out my life skills. I'd definitely recommend them to people who may be struggling, it's helped me move forward and get on the right track again."
